

## **DR. JARED SALETIN**

Jared M. Saletin PhD received his Bachelor's degree from Johns Hopkins University and his PhD in Psychology, with a focus on cognitive neuroscience, from the University of California, Berkeley. He then came to Brown University and completed a T32 postdoctoral fellowship in Child Mental Health research prior to joining the faculty of the Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior in fall of 2016 after receiving a K01 career development award from NIMH. Dr. Saletin currently serves as the Associate Director of the E.P. Bradley Hospital Sleep Research Laboratory. He oversees a series of mechanistic studies focused on sleep and neurodevelopment with a focus on how sleep and sleep physiology underpin and contribute to daytime brain and behavior dysfunction in attention-deficit/hyperactivity-disorder (ADHD). His long-term goal is to leverage sleep cognitive neuroscience to better understand neurodevelopmental conditions such as ADHD and relieve the burden of such conditions on children. His research has been funded by the National Institutes of Mental Health, the National Sciences Foundation, the Rhode Island Foundation, and the Jacobs Foundation.



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
