

Dr. Tanya Froehlich is a developmental-behavioral pediatrician and Professor of Pediatrics at Cincinnati Children's Hospital, where she serves as Sonya G. Oppenheimer Endowed Chair and Director of Research. Dr. Froehlich has a robust continuous record of NIH funding focused on predictors and correlates of ADHD medication response. Just as she seeks to move the needle on DBP clinical care through research, Dr. Froehlich is also passionate about enhancing care for ADHD and related disorders through teaching and other professional activities. She is Cincinnati Children's Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics Associate Fellowship Director and gives ADHD Continuing Medical Education presentations in international, national, and regional forums. Dr. Froehlich also served as a member of the ADHD Clinical Practice Guideline Committees for the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Society of Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics which formulated and published national standards for ADHD diagnosis and treatment for these two national organizations.

Dr. Froehlich earned her medical degree at Yale University, did her pediatrics residency at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and completed both a Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics clinical fellowship and a National Research Service Award fellowship at Cincinnati Children's Hospital.
