I am a licensed and board-certified child and adolescent clinical psychologist. I serve as Co-Director of the Department of Neuropsychology at the Kennedy Krieger Institute and hold an appointment as assistant professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. My clinical practice and research interests inform one another and center around improving healthcare systems and outcomes for youth with ADHD and related conditions.
